LOGLINE

When a beloved Atlanta school counselor is found murdered in her home, a determined single mother and former cop must protect her daughter and her own secrets, when all signs point to the killer being someone within their tight-knit community.

Because the most dangerous person in your life... might be somebody you know.

CONCEPT OVERVIEW

It's Somebody You Know is a pulse-pounding mystery-thriller that unfolds in one of Atlanta's historic neighborhoods, where front porches hide dark truths and smiling neighbors aren't always what they seem.

At the center is **Renee Bishop**, a widowed ex-detective turned real estate agent, whose instincts are reawakened when her daughter's best friend's mother is murdered. The investigation quickly becomes personal when Renee starts seeing disturbing parallels between this case and the unsolved death of her husband.

The closer Renee gets to the truth, the more danger she and her daughter are in. Secrets start unraveling. Trust starts breaking. And Renee begins to suspect that the killer isn't a stranger at all... but someone woven deeply into their everyday lives.

This is a story of female resilience, maternal instinct, and the terrifying realization that safety is sometimes a beautifully constructed illusion.

WHY THIS MOVIE?

KEY CHARACTERS

Maya Bishop (16): Renee's daughter, bright and opinionated, whose friendships and digital life hold more danger than she realizes.

Jordan Cook (40s): The victim. A well-liked counselor whose own secrets may have led to her murder.

Detective Marcus Shaw (50s): Renee's former partner. Protective but increasingly suspicious, of Renee.

Cassandra "Cass" Hill (40s): PTA mom, community organizer, and maybe more manipulative than anyone knows.

STRUCTURE & STYLE

- **Act I:** A murder rocks the neighborhood. Renee comforts her daughter, then gets pulled back into the investigation unofficially.
- **Act II:** Clues mount. Paranoia grows. Renee juggles a tense relationship with local police, buried trauma from her husband's death, and secrets in Maya's friend group.
- **Act III:** The twist drops: The killer isn't a stranger. The threat is painfully close. Renee must outsmart someone who knows her better than anyone.
- **Finale:** A life-or-death confrontation at a community event exposes everything and leaves Renee changed forever.

Visual style is crisp and modern with grounded lighting, Southern gothic undertones, and emotional close-ups. Think *Sharp Objects* meets *Only Murders in the Building* but with a gritty, maternal urgency.

MAYA BISHOP (16)

Renee's daughter. Smart, opinionated, and quietly rebellious. Unknowingly close to danger. **Casting Suggestions:**

- **Lidya Jewett** (*Nightbooks, Hidden Figures*) Can balance innocence with growing independence.
- **Saniyya Sidney** (*King Richard*) Exceptional emotional range, naturalistic and expressive.

- Demi Singleton (King Richard, Godfather of Harlem) Brings maturity beyond her years.
- **Navia Robinson** (*Raven's Home, Genius: MLK/X*) Confident, Atlanta-native energy.
- Marsai Martin (*Black-ish*) Smart, sassy, and grounded when needed.

DETECTIVE MARCUS SHAW (50s)

Renee's former partner. Loyal but increasingly suspicious. Protective of her... or hiding something?

Casting Suggestions:

- **Wendell Pierce** Brings gravitas and emotional tension to every scene (*The Wire*).
- **Courtney B. Vance** A master at subtle conflict and internalized pressure.
- **Mykelti Williamson** Intense, layered, and commands presence.
- **Glynn Turman** Adds weight, wisdom, and Southern flair.
- **Isaiah Washington** Can play both protector and potential threat.

CASSANDRA "CASS" HILL (40s)

PTA mom, charming and helpful... but calculating. Thinks she's the smartest woman in the room.

Casting Suggestions:

• **Kerry Washington** – Sophisticated and cunning, perfect for misdirection.

- **Aunjanue Ellis-Taylor** Brilliant at masking emotional volatility under composure.
- **Tasha Smith** Bold, expressive, and capable of scene-stealing manipulation.
- **Jurnee Smollett** Can tap into polished surface with simmering fire beneath.
- **Tika Sumpter** Stylish, confident, and excellent at complex female friendships turned rivalry.

JORDAN COOK (40s)

The victim. A beloved counselor whose double life unravels posthumously. Her secrets echo through the story.

Casting Suggestions:

- **Taraji P. Henson** Even in flashbacks, would carry weight and emotional resonance.
- Yaya DaCosta Has a serene surface but can hint at layers underneath.
- Essence Atkins Warm and likable with a quiet emotional depth.
- **Garcelle Beauvais** Glamorous but mysterious, great for someone whose death shakes the community.
- **Melinda Williams** Evokes sympathy and curiosity.
