





Keisha Thompson

Influencer

Social media maven who makes Karma go viral, amplifying Simone's personal vendetta into a cultural movement.

PLOT SUMMARY



ACT 1: HEARTBREAK.EXE

Simone is **dumped over video chat**—for an Al built using her own voice and data. Fueled by vodka and her rooftop sisterhood, she builds **Karma**, a dating accountability app.



ACT 2: VIRAL & VILIFIED

Karma goes viral, triggering backlash, betrayals, and emotional unraveling. Simone discovers the app is doing more harm than healing—and her own data was stolen to create Eva.



ACT 3: CRASH, REBOOT, RISE

After a very public takedown, Simone confronts the pain she caused and **pivots** Karma into Accountability, a platform for real connection. **Love**, **healing**, **and digital redemption** follow.
